Amber weather warning As shared earlier today, the Met Office have moved to an **amber** weather warning for Storm Babet later this week. From 6am on Thursday until 6pm on Friday, forecasters are warning of exceptionally wet conditions across Aberdeen city and a large part of Aberdeenshire. The rest of Aberdeenshire and most of Moray is covered by a yellow 'be aware' warning for rain for the same period, and there is also a yellow wind warning covering northern Scotland.

<u>Please ensure you have read the warning in full</u> and have planned in your teams for the potential impact such weather could have.

ADHD medications – supply issues Many of you will already be aware of the national supply issues with certain ADHD medications. <u>This update has been prepared with the Medicines Management team</u>; if you have specific queries, you should contact your clinical team.

Essential maintenance - Swan Secure Web Access 6pm-10pm TONIGHT With apologies for the short notice, please be aware the Swan Secure Web Access service will be unavailable intermittently this evening. If you require access to NHS Grampian systems during these times an alternative means of access should be identified. This maintenance is essential to perform mandatory updates to maintain the stability and security of the environment.

This maintenance work does not impact on remote access from NHS Grampian devices (e.g., using AOVPN or Direct Access on a laptop).

Winter vaccinations – new staff clinics Due to high levels of demand, we are setting up extra staff vaccination clinics on Level 3, Yellow Zone, ARI. You can book your slot using the vaccine booking portal. As this area is also home to the very busy eye out-patients clinic, we must remind you to use the stairs (opposite M&S on the concourse) to get to your appointment. A full guide to all the upcoming staff clinics across Moray, Aberdeenshire, and Aberdeen City is attached to the email used to send out this brief. The Aberdeen vaccination team will shortly begin visiting wards at ARI, Royal Cornhill, and Woodend to offer vaccination to in-patients. There may be opportunities for staff vaccination during these visits, but please bear in mind patients will be the priority. The vaccination team will liaise with wards directly.

We want to say a huge thank you to everyone who has come forward already to get vaccinated; the response this year has been brilliant, and this is reflected in the need to arrange extra clinics.

Childhood vaccination programme – we want your views! Staying with all things vaccination, the team in Public Health are keen to gather feedback from the parents or carers of children, aged 6 years or under, on their experience of childhood vaccination. They've put together a survey, which will take about 10 minutes to complete, to understand how easy (or hard) it is to get children vaccinated and how confident people are in the programme.
