
Here is the brief for Thursday 26 August 2021.

Staff 'flu vaccination - update Planning continues for this year's staff 'flu vaccination programme. As in previous years, staff will be offered the opportunity to book appointments or to access vaccination via the Peer to Peer scheme, as appropriate. However, this year the Occupational Health Service will **not** be booking appointments. A self-registration portal will be used instead and details on this will be available in the coming weeks. Please do not contact OHS for an appointment, as they will not be able to assist you.

'Flu remains a serious illness and we would encourage all those who are eligible to take up the offer of vaccination.

Finally, we know there is also significant interest in any potential COVID-19 booster programme. It remains the case that we await guidance from JCVI on what form this programme will take. This is expected in mid-September and we will look to implement their recommendations as quickly as possible.

Twice weekly asymptomatic testing With the lifting of many restrictions we are now seeing a significant rise in cases, as evidenced in the data we share with you daily. We're therefore urging everyone who has not yet signed up to participate in the twice weekly lateral flow testing, to consider doing so now.

New self-isolation guidance may also require you to have enough LFD kits to support 10 days continuous testing. **Please make sure you have a stock of LFD kits to support this and that all test results are recorded and your line manager informed, should this apply to you.**

Remember, vaccination and testing together are our best defence when it comes to protecting each other, our families, communities and patients. Vaccination alone is not enough - you can still unknowingly catch and transmit the virus.
