National Infection Prevention & Control Manual (NIPCM) relaunch The NIPCM was first published in 2012. To mark its 10th anniversary, the Chief Nursing Officer Alex McMahon has formally relaunched the manual. The NIPCM provides IPC guidance to all those involved in care provision and is considered best practice across all health and care settings in Scotland. Alex McMahon recorded this short video to mark the relaunch; you can also watch this film, produced by NHS Education for Scotland, which explains the purpose of the NIPCM.

Reminder - Unavailability of TrakCare (PMS) The TrakCare (PMS) System, will be unavailable **tomorrow** (Wednesday 13 July) between 00:00 – 07:00. Please be aware of the following during this period of downtime:

- Only send requests where the results are required for the immediate management of the patient.
- Only emergency requests will be processed.
- Routine requests will not be processed or analysed until the downtime for the TrakCare system is completed

Please use the following contingency measures for emergency requests and results:

- Make lab requests using the ERF system.
- Send completed request form and sample(s) together in the specimen bag.
- Critical results will be phoned out by lab staff.
- Results will be available on SCI throughout the upgrade, and in TrakCare once downtime is complete.
- Turnaround times will be longer than usual during this period.

Any routine electronic requesting via TrakCare will be processed once the TrakCare System is back online. The unavailability of TrakCare does **not** apply to Medical Genetics; please continue to send Genetics samples with request forms as normal.

SafeCare - Managing Nurse Staffing in Mental Health Managing nurse staffing levels on a day-to-day basis is really challenging. This is because the workload and acuity of our patients is always changing and the staff we planned to have on are not always available on the day. We need to have systems and processes that allow us to understand our staffing and risks throughout the day. SafeCare is a system that supports this professional decision-making process by providing an ability to review consistent and reliable information on patient acuity, activity, and available staffing. This system is being implemented across the inpatient departments on the Cornhill site and is an exciting development that will positively affect the way we professionally manage and talk about nurse staffing requirements within the organisation. Notifications via this process are automatically generated 28 days and 7 days prior to registration renewal.
