COVID-19 update The weekly Office of National Statistics published today continue to show a reduction in the number of people with the virus in Scotland – now 1 in 35 compared to 1 in 30 in the week before. Continuing this positive picture, our video update highlights new admissions to hospital in Grampian have plateaued at low levels and COVID-19 occupancy continues to reduce - now at 82 compared to 120 two weeks ago. It may not always feel like it for those of you on the ground, but nationally hospital service pressure due to COVID-19 appears to be reducing and virus-related calls to NHS24 continue to fall.
