**TSB Emergency Flee Fund** Survivors of domestic abuse encounter many obstacles from leaving an abusive relationship. Economic control over finances can be a major factor. Without control over their money and resources needed to leave and live independently, many women stay with abusers for longer, experiencing more harm as a result. Women who experience economic abuse are five times more likely to experience physical abuse than those who don't. When women experience economic abuse in the context of coercive control, they are at increased risk of being killed. In recognition of this and that the cost-of-living crisis is making it harder to leave abusive relationships, TSB is offering an emergency flee fund for customers. The bank also offers safe spaces in branches and online and the ability to open an account without the normally required documentation.
