Winter vaccinations As you may have seen reported, uptake of the winter vaccines is lower among health & social care staff this year. We're keen to understand why and there's an opportunity for you have your say below. We also want to draw your attention to opportunities for vaccination in Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire:

- From today, all vaccination clinics in Aberdeenshire are open for health & social care staff to drop in for vaccinations. If you work in a patient or client facing role, or you are eligible for vaccination due to your age, having a long-term condition, being an unpaid carer, living with someone who is immunocompromised, or you are pregnant, you can drop-in to any of the Aberdeenshire clinics <u>a full list is available here</u>. The drop-in opportunity is for health & social care staff only, at busy times queues may be closed and you may be asked to come back at another day/time.
- There are appointment slots for health & social care staff available **this week** at **Aberdeen City Vaccination Centre**. Call 0800 030 4713 to book your boosters. Please note, all Aberdeen clinics are appointment **only**, there are no drop-in opportunities for staff or the public in the city.

Deactivation of 'The Management of the Workforce during and after major incidents including pandemic' policy This policy was invoked in the first stages of the pandemic; it will be formally deactivated tomorrow (1 November). The policy gave a framework to effectively manage both services and workforce, outlining the workforce arrangements which may be invoked for the duration of a major incident. Many provisions of the policy have naturally ceased to be used as the management of the pandemic evolved. One change to highlight is the period covered by a self-certification for sickness absence without the requirement for a fit note. This will revert to 7 days, from the 14 days in place during the pandemic.

Dr Gray's Hospital – developing the Plan for the Future A dedicated Dr Gray's Hospital Plan for the Future is being developed to set the direction for the hospital over the next ten years and beyond. Over 130 colleagues have already taken part in interactive workshops to share their ideas and aspirations for Dr Gray's and to tell us what is important to them. If you haven't done so already, here's your opportunity to get involved:
