**Update to Patient Placement Tool** From next Monday (8 August), in line with national guidance to end Respiratory/Non-respiratory Pathways and move back to Standard Infection Control Precautions and Transmission Based Precautions, the Respiratory Pathway details will be removed from the Patient Placement Tool. The updated Patient Placement Tool (v16) will be available on the <u>IPC intranet page</u> (networked devices only) for areas which use paper copies. Please ensure earlier versions are withdrawn and destroyed. For areas using the Electronic Patient Record (EPR), it will be updated on Monday 8 August and available via the usual route.
