Launch of HIV Informed Today, on World AIDS Day, Waverley Care, NHS Scotland, and the Scottish Government have launched HIV Informed, a free online learning hub for Scotland's health and social care workforce. HIV Informed challenges outdated knowledge, provides up-to-date information, and supports everyone to deliver inclusive care. Stigma remains a serious challenge for many people living with HIV, particularly in health and social care settings. This short video, produced for this campaign, reveals the impact this stigma has on people with HIV.
