**Lady Helen Parking Centre - what happens next?** As confirmed on 23 April, Aberdeen City Council have granted us a temporary variation to the planning permission for the multi-storey car park at Foresterhill. They agreed to this under the following conditions:

- Staff many only use Level 6 and above. These floors are not exclusive to staff; patients and visitors may park on any level they wish.
- We will control and monitor car park usage with automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) and a registration system. A short life working group has already been set up to get this in place as quickly as possible. The current target is late Summer
- We have provided an Active Travel plan to the council, and we continue to encourage everyone
  to use alternatives to the car to get to and from work, not just at Foresterhill.

We must stress this is a temporary variation to the planning permission. We believe we can make this much valued facility work on a shared basis, but we need your support to make this possible. As we share further information about the new usage policy, please abide by it and encourage your colleagues to do the same. Working in partnership is the only way we can build a case to make this change a permanent one.

Portfolio review - update from Adam Coldwells, Interim Chief Executive Portfolio review - update from Adam Coldwells, Interim Chief Executive Following work undertaken by an Organisational Change Steering Group for all of the Portfolio Leads impacted by the recommendations of the Portfolio review; I am very pleased to inform you of the following appointments with immediate effect,

- Geraldine Fraser, Chief Officer, Acute Services, reporting to the Chief Executive
- Paul Bachoo, Medical Director, Acute Services, reporting to the Executive Medical Director

Together with June Barnard, as Nurse Director, Acute Services, reporting to the Executive Nurse Director, these three roles form the Acute Services Triumvirate. All three members of the triumvirate will be members of the Chief Executive Team. This is an important milestone following the portfolio review and I want to thank all of those involved to date. June, Paul, and Geraldine will now lead the Acute Services through a 4-month transition phase which will include the simplification of governance processes and structures and will review the management and leadership arrangements. The transition will be conducted using all the correct organisational policies and will enable colleagues across acute services and with the Moray Health and Social Care Partnership to both engage and be involved in the changes. The triumvirate will be speaking with teams in the very near future to share the broad principles for the transition.

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World Hand Hygiene Day – gloves off The theme for this year's global campaign - 'It Might Be Gloves. It's Always Hand Hygiene' - reflects our own Gloves Off initiative, aimed at ensuring non-sterile disposable gloves are only used when they need to be. This reduces infection risk, reduces staff skin conditions, and reduces the impact on our environment. Our data for April 2024 to March 2025 confirms glove use has reduced below pre-pandemic levels and has halved the volume used in April 2020 to March 2021. This not only reduces risk of HAI but also impact on the environment as there is less waste to be disposed of. In addition, there is a pattern of less Irritant Contact Dermatitis, which can be caused by wearing occlusive gloves for too long. All of these were objectives of the campaign. What a great achievement – well done everyone!
