Financial position As the finance paper at today's board meeting (Item 10, available here: 10 April 2025) describes, we are reporting the highest forecast financial overspend in value terms for 2025/26 in Scotland. The Scottish Government requires us to develop a financial recovery plan by 7 June to reduce this forecast deficit to £45million. This is the maximum amount of brokerage (a type of government loan) they have approved. Achieving this will require a further £23million of savings to be found, in addition to those which services have already committed to and ongoing value and sustainability work. To support this urgent and important work, finance will be speaking with senior budget holders over the coming weeks and would appreciate your support in prioritising these meetings. The Scottish Government is also commissioning an external review and more detail on this work will be shared once available.
