Stage 4 escalation – update Our Chair Alison Evison & interim Chief Executive Adam Coldwells have recorded <u>a short update video</u> for staff to share key insights from our first meeting with the Assurance Board and what's next in the escalation process with the Scottish Government. Disclosure Scotland Act – sharing disclosure outcomes The new Disclosure Scotland Act, which came into effect from 1 April 2025, makes it mandatory for employees to become Members of the Protecting Vulnerable Groups (PVG) Scheme if they are in a regulated role. If you have been identified by your manager as being in a regulated role, requiring membership of the PVG Scheme, you should have received an e-mail from Disclosure Scotland containing a link to complete your part of the PVG Application.

Once Disclosure Scotland have processed your application, you will receive a confirmation e-mail that your Disclosure is ready to view through your ScotAccount. You are required to share this with us, as your employer. You have 14 calendar days to share the outcome. You will receive reminder e-mails from Disclosure Scotland to share the Disclosure. You can share your Disclosure after viewing it by clicking the share option on screen in your account. Yellow Card Scheme Has a patient in your care suffered a side effect of medication? The Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) runs the Yellow Card scheme, which collects and monitors information on suspected safety concerns involving healthcare products, like a side effect with a medicine or an adverse medical device incident. The scheme relies on voluntary reporting of problems with a healthcare product by the public (including patients, parents, and care givers) as well as from healthcare professionals. Reporting is simple and happens via this website: <u>Yellow Card | Making medicines and medical devices safer</u>

Side effects due to a privately prescribed, purchased over the counter, herbal, or alternative medications can also be reported via the Yellow Card scheme.
