New Toolbox Talk: enteric outbreak management With Winter fast approaching, a new Toolbox Talk has been developed to support staff in recognising and managing enteric outbreaks (e.g., norovirus, rotavirus, salmonella). It outlines key signs, sample collection guidance, transmission precautions, cleaning protocols, and staff exclusion criteria. Winter '25 schedule change: National Distribution Centre This year's ordering and delivery schedule of goods from the National Distribution Centre during Weeks 51, 52 and 01 – the run up to Christmas and then over the festive period - <u>are available via this link to the procurement intranet site</u>. All services must plan now to avoid delays and additional pressure during these weeks. Last year's NDC deliveries had significant delays due to a heavy increase in ordering from boards during these weeks. This impacted many of our wards. Stores Cages Staying with all things procurement, services **must** return stores cages after use; they are not to be used for local storage and orders must be unpacked promptly. Holding onto these cages causes significant delays to local and national supply chains, as newly received orders cannot be delivered. Services based at Foresterhill should contact their local porters for collection. If you have cages awaiting collection outwith Foresterhill, please contact the Transport Department gram.transportlogistics@nhs.scot for uplift.

Information security and posting Here are some top tips when it comes to keeping information secure when sending by post:

• Double-check letters before posting them. Picking up two letters instead of one is an easy mistake to make if you're working your way through a stack of them. Ask a colleague to double-check the right letter is in the right envelope or use place-markers to help you spot where one letter ends and the next one starts.

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Always include a return address, on the back of the envelope, to ensure items sent to the wrong
place can be returned without being opened. If you're concerned about identifying a letter from
the NHS, double-envelope the contents and put the return address on the back of the inner
envelope.
