Availability of 2025 Annual Benefit Statements and Annual Benefit Statements combined with a Remediable Service Statements SPPA have published this circular to advise Annual Benefit Statements (ABS) and Annual Benefit Statements, combined with a Remediable Service Statements (for active members who are eligible for the 2015 Remedy), are available on the SPPA's online member portal. This is the second year Annual Benefit Statements combined with a Remediable Service Statements have been provided offering members who are eligible for the 2015 Remedy with estimates in the final salary (legacy) scheme and reformed (CARE) scheme. Statements are available on the SPPA's newly launched member portal, Engage. Members are receiving emails or letters directly to tell them how they can register on the new portal and view their statement. Supporting with planned admissions to ensure positive outcomes from the admission are achieved is a key part of my role. I help ensure discharges are carefully planned and make referrals to the community learning disability team if needed."
