ICON – launched across Grampian We are committed to delivering the ICON programme throughout Grampian. ICON supports parents and carers to cope with a crying baby and prevents the risk of Abusive Head Trauma (AHT). This programme will be delivered by midwives, health visitors, and family nurses and has four key messages:

- I Infant crying is normal, and it will stop.
- C Comfort methods will sometimes help, and the crying will stop.
- **O** It's ok to walk away. Ok to walk away if the baby is safe and the crying is getting to you.
- N Never ever shake or hurt a baby
