Mask usage 'Flu admissions to ARI continue to rise rapidly. From today, all staff in all clinical areas of the hospital must ensure they are wearing Type IIR fluid repellent masks. Visitors will be asked to do the same. Further information is being circulated directly to staff via the acute sector management.

For clarity, we are now asking for mask usage by all staff in all clinical areas of ARI and RACH. This reflects the significant number of respiratory illnesses being treated in both hospitals. Any member of staff – whether clinical or not – is expected to don a Type IIR mask if they are entering a clinical area in ARI or RACH. By clinical areas, we mean wards, clinics, etcs. Cafes, offices, and the main thoroughfares of these hospitals are not clinical areas. We will continue to provide updates via this brief. If you work in ARI or RACH and have further questions, please speak to your line manager.

Infection prevention and control – winter advice sessions Starting today and running into next week, the infection prevention and control team are offering advice sessions on Teams, to discuss the management of patients, equipment, and the environment to halt the spread of winter illnesses. Public Health Scotland publishes evidence of 'flu vaccination effectiveness Public Health Scotland have shared the latest evidence of the effectiveness of the 'flu vaccine. So far this winter, vaccinated children are 78% less likely to be admitted to hospital with 'flu if vaccinated; adults over the age of 65 who are vaccinated are 37% less likely to be hospitalised. You can read the full update from PHS by following this link. We cannot stress enough; it is not too late to get your jab. All NHS staff, and social care staff with direct client contact, are eligible for a free 'flu jab. Vaccination centres are open for dropins, and our teams are offering extra pop-up clinics and roving vaccinators. The latest information on this is available on the intranet via this link.

 Return cages ASAP. This ensures all areas can get the deliveries they will need. Both our local logistics team and national procurement have noted a significant reduction in cage returns recently. Cages are not to be used for local storage.
