Managing petty cash The cash imprest policy was revised at the start of this year with an SOP circulated around those responsible for holding and managing petty cash balances, with the aim of ensuring proper handling of cash transactions across NHS Grampian. If you have any involvement with petty cash, either as a user or holder, please make sure you are familiar with the policy and follow the required procedures for all cash-related activity. Even small amounts of spend matter—ignoring these can lead to significant cumulative impact over time. Your attention to detail helps maintain compliance and supports financial integrity across the organisation.

Bin stickers to assist with waste separation We are still seeing the wrong waste appearing in the wrong bins. To give a quick visual reminder, we have produced new stickers for bin lids, as follows:

- For Orange bins, to make clear batteries and metals must **never** go in these bins
- For food caddies, with a list of what can and can't go in these bins

Remember, getting waste in the right bins saves money and the planet. A previous audit found 12% of orange bag waste was actually non-infectious, non-clinical, packaging and plastics which could be recycled.
