Ditch the desk bins A managed approach to the removal of all desk bins across all NHS Grampian sites was agreed last year, marking a significant step forward in reducing waste disposal costs and increasing recycling rates. Disposing of general waste costs NHS Grampian up to four times more than recycling, and has a significant detrimental impact on our planet. The removal of desk bins also prevents domestic staff from having to bend down under hundreds of desks daily, which has led to musculoskeletal injuries.

This switch continues as part of our commitment to address the climate emergency and promote sustainability. Please make a conscious effort to use central recycling points per office or floor (suited to your area) as these are made available to you, and help contribute significantly to our environmental targets. Temporary hot water disruption at Ashgrove House Starting at 1pm on Monday, 18 August, the steam line to Ashgrove House will be isolated to allow for essential maintenance scheduled for the next day. There will be no hot water in the building until repairs are completed. Maintenance is expected to begin around 8am and will last approximately 3–4 hours. Hot water may take longer to be fully restored after the works are completed. Cold water will remain available for toilet flushing, hand washing, and other basic needs.
