'Flu vaccination – don't miss out With the latest figures from Public Health Scotland showing a significant jump in confirmed cases, we're taking this opportunity to remind you of your vaccination opportunities:

- Drop-in to Aberdeen City Vaccination and Wellbeing Hub, Mon-Sat, 10am-4.30pm
- Drop-in to any Aberdeenshire clinic (except Huntly) during November. Locations and opening time information is available at this link.
- OHS are hosting a clinic at Foresterhill Lea on Tuesday 18 November, prioritising Facilities and Estates colleagues. Contact them directly to book.
- Book your appointment online <u>using the national vaccination website</u>.

All NHS staff and social care colleagues with direct client contact are eligible for a free 'flu vaccination.

Across Grampian, our clinics offered 65,484 appointments in October; there were 12,427 Did Not Attends. If you have friends or family eligible for vaccination and the appointment date or time doesn't suit, please encourage them to reschedule, so slots are available for others. Thank you.
