

'Flu update As of Sunday (the most recent data we have available) there were 57 people in hospital with 'flu across Grampian. The majority are in ARI, with cases also recorded in DGH and RACH, the latter also seeing cases of RSV in children.

As a reminder, staff and visitors in ARI and RACH are being asked to wear fluid repellent surgical masks in clinical areas. The infection prevention and control team are running advice sessions on managing patients, equipment, and the environment to prevent transmission of winter viruses. You don't need to book, just follow the Teams link to the most convenient session. All dates/times are at this link. If you are eligible for a 'flu jab, and haven't had it yet, please take up the offer. Vaccination centres are open for drop-ins; for the latest information, simply follow this link.

Please remind family, friends, neighbours, etc to **not** visit people in hospital if they have symptoms of respiratory illnesses (cough, sore throat, runny nose) or if they have had episodes of diarrhoea and/or vomiting. You should not attend work if unwell with an illness which can be passed on. If you have experienced diarrhoea and/or vomiting you should be 48 hours symptom free before returning to work.
