'10 before 10' - starting Monday in ARI Most days as an organisation we discharge enough people to allow us to admit those who arrive through the course of the day requiring care. However, for a host of different reasons, too many discharges happen late in the day. By then we already have people awaiting admission in both ED and AMIA. Starting on Monday, in ARI, '10 before 10' aims to ensure at least 10 meaningful patient moves (most often discharges but also ward moves and AMIA acceptances) happen between 8-10am each day. The purpose is to establish a reliable pattern of early patient movement; with the benefits it will bring for them and you as staff.

'10 before 10' isn't a performance target, nor is it about creating a league table of wards. It's about recognising small delays, across many different areas, add up to major challenges. The decision to discharge will, as always, be a clinical one. What '10 before 10' seeks to do is create a shared focus and ensure we are having early conversations with patients and families to understand what they need to be able to go home.

For those interested there will be a daily 10-minute wash-up and brief at 2.45pm in the Secondary Control Room, Office 12, Emergency Care Centre, Matthew Hay Building, Level 1, Green Zone (situated on the same corridor as the Site and Capacity hub). This is a drop-in session for anyone interested in what we're doing to catch-up, and to bring along challenges and issues they've had regarding '10 before 10' so they can be addressed quickly.
