Prevention & Management of Violence & Aggression survey findings and recommendations now available In September 2024, the Corporate Health & Safety team conducted a survey to explore the enablers and barriers to reporting workplace violence and aggression. With 881 responses, the survey revealed many of you experience such incidents, often affecting your health. However, underreporting remains common due to fear, time constraints, and uncertainty about what qualifies as reportable. Confidence in using reporting tools like Datix varies, and access is inconsistent. While peer support is strong, perceptions of management's commitment to safety are mixed, and you want clearer feedback on reported incidents. In response, the Health & Safety team proposed SMART recommendations, including mandatory safety training for managers, improved leadership visibility, a more transparent and supportive work environment, with key milestones aligned with our delivery plan.
