**Help break the stigma for birth parents** The Supporting Birth Parents Project, developed to support parents whose children have been permanently removed from their care, has secured £75,000 in funding from the Corra Foundation to continue providing peer support, group and one-to-one sessions, and mentoring. The project provides a trauma-informed space where birth parents can heal, connect, and be empowered by others with shared experiences. The stigma around birth parents is real – but it's often based on harmful assumptions. Many of the parents have faced domestic abuse, trauma, and isolation. This project is about listening, understanding and helping others feel less alone.

Please watch and share this <u>short film where birth parents share their experiences</u> in their own words. The project team can provide support for birth parents, attend team meetings or staff events to deliver information and training sessions, and offer guidance to start local support groups.
