Driving etiquette and site safety In recent weeks we have received complaints and concerns about the standard of driving on our sites. Please keep your speed to no more than 15 mph on internal site roads and car parks and drive with due care and attention. We have a high volume of vehicles coming and going on all sites, as well as cyclists, pedestrians, people using wheelchairs or other mobility aids, and the safety of **all** site users must be paramount.

We also continue to get reports of inconsiderate, sometimes dangerous, car parking. Hatched areas must not be used for parking; these areas must be kept clear for emergency vehicle access. Spaces reserved for patients in front of our clinical buildings must not be used for parking when you are on shift. We would also remind everyone reading to ensure ambulance bays, 'blue badge' spaces, and loading bay/delivery areas are left clear. Do **not** park on double yellow lines or move cones to be able to park. Traffic markings are in place to ensure **all** vehicles can move safely around our sites.

PVG membership – five-year renewal system Protecting Vulnerable Groups (PVG) membership will transition to a five-year renewal system starting from April 2026. This means current lifetime membership will be replaced by a time-limited scheme membership, requiring renewal every 5 years. What will this mean in practice?

- New recruits to the organisation who join the PVG scheme, from April 2026, will automatically be enrolled in a five-year membership, tailored to their specific regulated role.
- Existing PVG scheme members will be transferred to the five-year membership system in a
 phased manner. This will itself happen over five years, so not all PVG members will move over at
 once. We are working with Disclosure Scotland to understand the requirements for the transition.
 Further updates will be shared as we get them.
