Stop press – extra staff 'flu clinic, ARI Thanks to exceptional demand – 170 people were vaccinated there last week – another drop in 'flu vaccination clinic has been arranged at the ARI fracture clinic (Level 0, Green Zone). It will take place **tomorrow** (Friday) between 9am and 4pm. A big thank you to everyone who has come along already; clinics have been busy and it's great to see. Clinical Biochemistry and Haematology labs – contingency during cold water shutdown As highlighted in yesterday's brief, there is a planned shutdown of the ARI cold water supply for critical repairs this Sunday (21 September) commencing at 8am for approximately 8-10 hours. The automated analysers in Clinical Biochemistry and Haematology depend on stable water supplies to function and this shutdown has the potential to impact our ability to provide service. To conserve our internal water reservoirs and ensure we can continue to process samples during this prolonged period we are asking you to only send critical/urgent samples for testing during this period. Please carefully consider the clinical importance of the requested test and if it can wait until after the shutdown period. We may vet sample requests using the clinical details provided as well as priority locations and hold routine samples back until the shutdown has passed.

Windows 11 upgrade – the final push A big thank you to everyone who has already upgraded their devices to Windows 11; more than three quarters of the compatible machines across the organisation are now running the new system. With two weeks left, it is vital all remaining, eligible, devices are upgraded. This will avoid cyber security risks and additional financial costs. If you've been ignoring the upgrade prompt to date, please act now. Unless the Digital team have been made aware of a genuine reason to stay on Windows 10 (e.g., software compatibility), machines which could run Windows 11 may inevitably lose network access to files and systems until they are updated.

As a rough guide, any device with a serial number starting with NHSG18, NHSG19, NHSG20, NHSG21, NHSG22, NHSG23, NHSG24, NHSG25 should be upgradeable. We've started pushing the upgrade to all compliant machines, but this depends on devices being powered on and having enough disk space. Some upgrades may need to be completed manually. Managers, please ensure your team has upgraded, or has a plan to do so. If you know there are blocks to upgrading, such as software compatibility, please inform the Digital team immediately.

Why are we promoting the upgrade so much? It's simple; Windows 10 is approaching end-of-support, meaning no future security patches. Unsupported systems are a major cyber risk. We must meet national security standards and running out of date systems could lead to breaches. As highlighted above, devices which aren't updated may lose access to the network, making your job harder to do.

Please do everything you can to ensure your devices—and those in your area—are upgraded before **Wednesday 1 October**. If you need help or advice, please contact the IT Service Desk.
