Windows 11 Upgrade Rollout – Latest Update The optional Windows 11 upgrade pop-up is now live and has been successfully deployed to around 5,000 hybrid worker laptops. This is a key milestone in our upgrade programme, helping us move closer to full compliance and improved security across our digital estate. Thanks to those who have already done so, but please remember this needs to be done, so please take the time to run the upgrade, if offered, ASAP.

A huge thank you to the 1,000+ colleagues who have already taken the time to complete the upgrade form. Your input is invaluable in helping us target updates effectively. If you haven't yet filled in the form, please do so as soon as possible – the more information we have, the smoother the rollout will be for everyone. Emergency Alerts system test The UK government is testing the Emergency Alerts system on Sunday 7 September at 3pm. Compatible mobile phones and tablets will receive an alert, make a loud siren-like sound, and vibrate. You will not need to take any action. Opting out is not recommended but may be helpful for those in unsafe home situations, or who have a cognitive condition (e.g., dementia) and may find the alert distressing.

Chronic Pain Study Day for nurses, AHPs and psychologists: Chronic pain affects 38% of the Scottish population. The chronic pain management service is running a free face-to-face study day on Tuesday 18 November where you can learn more about what chronic pain is and how to manage it more effectively. NHS Grampian Charity The charity has today announced £3.1M in funding for three different projects. More than £1.5M has been awarded to develop and deliver a pathway of care for people living with functional disorder symptoms. Around £1.1M has been awarded to implement the Putting People First approach to place patients and communities at the centre of decision making. Finally, almost £500,000 has been awarded to develop an innovative whole-system pathway to provide early identification, assessment, and tailored support for children with neuro-developmental differences in Grampian. These projects are exciting tests of change, with each expected to begin in the coming months, and being funded by the charity for two years.
