**TrakCare Essential Maintenance Notice** We've been advised essential maintenance is required on the TrakCare system. To facilitate this, there will be two brief service interruptions next week, as follows:

- Tuesday 24 June, 12noon There should be minimal to no disruption for TrakCare users, however, there may be a temporary impact on CDD and BOXI live reporting services. The maintenance window will last approximately 5 minutes, after which all services should resume as normal.
- Wednesday 25 June, 12noon At 12, all active TrakCare users will be logged out. The
  maintenance window is around 5 minutes, after which users can log back in and resume normal
  activity.

You must ensure any unsaved data is saved before the scheduled times. If any data appears to be missing after the maintenance, please re-enter it manually. We apologise in advance and appreciate your patience and understanding as we carry out this essential work to maintain system performance and reliability.
