**Portfolio Review Update** Last autumn the Chief Executive commissioned a review into the portfolio structures established across the health and social care system in Grampian during 2021. This topic was covered in Ask Adam videos and the recommendations from the review were published and presented to GAPF, ACF and the Wider System Leadership at the end of last year. Extensive work went into understanding how the portfolio model was being delivered and received across our system, leading to several recommendations. We would like to thank all those senior managers who contributed through this process and to share the Portfolio Review Report for those who may not have seen it.
