**Peer vaccinator recruitment** Thank you for the interest already in our call for peer vaccinators for this year's 'flu vaccination programme. A primary care peer vaccination programme is being offered this year, but this has already been confirmed with the participating practices.

Paving the way for the use of AI in lung cancer care Following the success of our Innovation Hub's GRACE project to incorporate AI in the detection of lung cancer, we are now trialling a process that could be embedded in lung cancer care across Scotland. Diagnostic care for lung cancer has improved across Grampian thanks to the use of innovative Artificial Intelligence (AI) technology scanning x-ray images for more than 120 potential issues, and the team is building on these results to inform the roll-out of AI in other areas. All chest x-ray images continue to be manually assessed by radiologists, but the use of Annalise CXR software highlights images that may show signs of lung cancer, so they can be reviewed more urgently. We are working alongside the Accelerated National Innovation Adoption (ANIA) Pathway team on this potentially transformative work. **Windows 11 Upgrade** As it's Friday, it's the perfect time for office-based, 9–5 colleagues to kick off their Windows 11 upgrade before heading home. Let it run over the weekend and come back Monday ready to go.

A huge thank you to everyone who has upgraded already; we're sitting at 44% of compatible machines upgraded, a fantastic achievement! We need to keep this pace up, to ensure we meet the deadline and don't incur additional costs for maintaining devices still running Windows 10. If you've been prompted to upgrade and haven't yet done so, please upgrade as soon as possible, unless you have a valid reason not to (e.g., known software/hardware incompatibility listed in the FAQ such as EMIS etc). We're now gradually rolling out a Windows 11 Upgrade shortcut to all desktops and laptops. This allows you to start the upgrade at any time, without waiting for the pop-up notification.
