**Programming note** The final brief of 2025 will be issued on Wednesday, then it will take a short break, returning on Monday 5 January 2026. We will issue urgent or emergency globals, as required.

**Industrial action confirmed** On Friday afternoon it was confirmed resident doctor members of BMA Scotland have voted in favour of strike action. BMA Scotland has stated their intention to strike from 7am on Tuesday 13 January until 7am on Saturday 17 January 2026 if no acceptable agreement can be reached with Scottish Government.

Our primary focus now is understanding what impact strike action will have on our services and mitigating that as much as possible. Whatever mitigations we do put in place, we can expect disruption and rescheduling of routine care.

We recognise that periods of industrial action create uncertainty and there may be a range of strong feelings. While we understand there are differing views regarding the dispute, we are confident you will continue to treat each other with professional respect and courtesy. Our collective priority remains working together to support our patients during this time.

**Staff 'flu clinics - ARI – today/tomorrow** If you have still to get your 'flu jab, there are staff vaccination clinics in healthpoint on the ARI main concourse (beside the public waiting area/reception desk) today and tomorrow, between 9am-4pm. All NHS staff, and social care staff who have direct client contact, are eligible for a free 'flu jab. We strongly encourage everyone eligible for vaccination to get their jab.
