The issue – which is affecting all Dragon users – has been logged with the vendor and is actively being investigated. If you are unable to retrieve letters, please log a call with the Service Desk giving the following information:

- CHI, date and time of letter
- NHSG number of PC / Laptop
- Document specialty

We apologise for any inconvenience this issue may be causing and appreciate your patience while work is ongoing to find a resolution.

Labs – do you need a paper report? The Laboratory Directorate generates thousands of paper result reports daily. To save money, staff time, reduce waste. and be more environmentally friendly they would like to minimise report printing. Are paper results reports still necessary in your service? It is possible to turn off printing of reports from Microbiology, Virology, Clinical Biochemistry, Haematology, Immunology and Pathology. Please note, this is not a current option for Genetics reports.

Within ENRICH, there is RICH voices, a group open to all but with a particular focus on care home staff, residents, and families.
