Do **not** park on double yellow lines or move cones to be able to park. Traffic markings are in place to ensure **all** vehicles can move safely around our sites.

Point of Care/EPR disruption – coming soon Due to a scheduled server upgrade next Tuesday (4 March), results from several Point of Care devices will be unavailable within the electronic patient record (EPR) for the duration of the upgrade. The servers will be down for approximately 4 hours (10am-2pm). Once the upgrade has taken place, results for tests taken during the downtime will start filtering through to the EPR. The devices involved are listed below. Please note, this will only affect the transfer of data. The analysers themselves will be unaffected, patient testing will still be available on the ward throughout, and blood gas results will not be affected.
