HIV, Stigma, and You While newly diagnosed infections are reducing, HIV related stigma remains a significant barrier within health and care settings. NHS Education for Scotland have adapted local work to create the HIV, Stigma, and You e-learning module, <u>available via this link</u>. Participants will be better informed about HIV and be able to work in a person-centred, anti-discriminatory way, with those with the virus or at risk of it.

**World IVF Day** This is an opportunity to show our appreciation of our embryologists and andrologists at Aberdeen Fertility Centre and around the world. The level of skill, precision, dedication and care that is showcased has helped people globally. Between 1991 and 2021, there were over 390,000 births because of Fertility treatment. 52,500 patients having in vitro fertilisation (IVF) treatment at Human Fertilisation and Embryology Authority (HFEA) licensed fertility centres in the UK in 2022 alone!

**GHAT 40**<sup>th</sup> **anniversary exhibition** The Grampian Hospitals Art Trust is marking 40 years of healing through art this year. As part of the celebrations a special exhibition is taking at the iconic Bon Accord (Uptown) Baths in Aberdeen.
