

Care of patients' property & valuables The guidance for the care of patients' property and valuables has been updated with input from colleagues in finance, nursing, and security and is available on Grampian Guidance via this link or by searching 'Care of patients' property and valuables'. There is no longer a flowchart, please refer to the updated guidance for the correct procedure. There should be notices displayed in all patient bays advising NHS Grampian cannot accept responsibility for patient belongings other than for valuable items which have been handed in for safe-keeping and a receipt obtained. It is important patients are aware of this, so they can arrange for family members to take home any items of value rather than having them on the ward.

TrakCare preferences – please check Following the recent TrakCare upgrade, some users have reported changes to their preferences. This can affect the time taken for the screens to display, including:

- Unacknowledged Results
- Current Inpatients
- Correspondence Referrals



You may also notice missing information or slower system performance. If this is the case, please take the following steps:

- Check your preferences for the affected screens, following the steps in this guide.
- If everything looks correct, try deleting and re-applying your preferences this often resolves the issue.

The Veterans In-Service Injury Network The Veterans In-Service Injury Network (VISIN) is a Scottish Government initiative hosted by NHS Highland. VISIN will provide independent, expert clinical review of military service-related injuries, which remain a concern despite treatment, or conditions which develop earlier than expected due to military service. GPs, practice nurses, First Contact/ Primary Care/ Community physiotherapists and occupational therapists will be able to refer UK veteran patients to a multi-disciplinary team review with experts from various clinical specialities, as well as those with experience of service-related injuries. The MDT will provide recommendations for potential further treatment as well as details of MOD, local authority, public and third sector organisations that the veteran, referrer and GP could engage for tailored advice, guidance and support.
