Evaluation of Special Rules for Terminal Illness (SRTI) in the delivery of devolved disability benefits' The Scottish Government has commissioned an independent research company to gather feedback from registered medics and nurses, to understand how changes to Special Rules for Terminal Illness (SRTI) have been experienced and understood by clinicians. This will help them to assess whether the introduction of SRTI is meeting its policy commitments. They want to hear from those who have direct experience of completing BASRiS forms or the DWP equivalent (SR1 or DS1500 forms) as well as those who are eligible to do so i.e., they have been involved in the diagnosis and/or medical care of individuals with a terminal illness.
