Good Financial Governance – getting help Our Finance and Procurement colleagues have collated answers to some regularly asked questions, please visit <u>How Do I?</u> for answers.

Throughout the week we have been directing you to sections of the new Finance, Procurement and Performance Directorate intranet site which has been designed with a vision of easy access to key tools and documents you need to do your job. Improvements to User Access Requests in ServiceNow Over the past few months, we've been monitoring the use of the New, Change, and Remove User Access request forms in ServiceNow. This has helped us identify common errors and areas where improvements can be made. To improve the usability and quality of these forms, we'll be introducing gradual updates across the request forms. One key change is to the 'Change User Access Request': going forward, the authorising manager will also be required to complete this request, aligning it with the process for New and Remove access requests.

Quick Reminder: When to Use Each Form

- New User Access Use this to request a new username and password for a user.
- Change User Access Use this to update user details or modify access to a clinical system the user already has access to.
- Remove User Access Use this to temporarily or permanently remove a user's access.
