

Lady Helen Parking Centre - next steps As previously shared, we have been granted a temporary variation to the planning permission for the multi-storey car park at Foresterhill. In practice, this means staff will be able to park in Level 6 and above. All levels of the facility will be open for use by patients and/or visitors. [We are aiming to implement a new management plan](#) (intranet link, networked devices only) by late summer.

We must stress again; this is a temporary variation to the planning permission. If, at the end of the two-year variation, Aberdeen City Council believe we have not managed sharing the facility effectively, they may enforce the original planning permission. We firmly believe the management plan we have developed will work, but we need your support to make it possible. This is our opportunity to build a case to make this change a permanent one. We very much hope you will work with us to make this a reality.

Chest x-ray Annalise AI project - change to sign-in process If you have an Annalise AI enterprise account as part of this innovation project, there is a change to the sign-in process. Effective immediately, when you log in to your account for the first time, you will see the screen below and be prompted to sign in to your Microsoft Account using your NHS email address and password. This will log you into your account. If you encounter any issues, please log a call using the online IT Service Desk Portal. You may be asked to perform this verification step regularly to ensure security policies are maintained.
