TrakCare maintenance notice Following the TrakCare upgrade, essential system maintenance is required to ensure the failover process functions fully, which is crucial in emergency situations. All active TrakCare users will be automatically logged out at 12noon tomorrow (Tuesday 29 April). You will be able to log back in immediately, however any clinical/patient data entered must be saved before 12noon. Unsaved data must be re-entered manually.

Proper battery disposal As a reminder of the importance of correctly segregating and disposing of our waste, our clinical waste contractor has been in touch to advise they suffered a small fire at their treatment plant due to batteries being disposed of in orange bags. While the waste in question didn't come from NHS Grampian, it's important to be make sure batteries are properly disposed of. Orange bags are shredded as part of the treatment process, and it was within the shredder the batteries caused the fire.

While their fire suppression system worked well on this occasion, meaning minimal damage to equipment, it could have been very different. Damage to their plant creates backlogs of waste to be processed, which could impact on their ability to collect from our sites. **Please do not place any equipment containing batteries into orange bags;** instead remove batteries from all equipment before disposal and send for recycling at Central Stores.

International Workers Memorial Day There will be a short service of reflection in the ARI Chapel (Pink Zone, Level 2) today, between 11.50am-12.15pm. This will include a minute's silence at 12noon to remember all those who have lost their lives whilst at work. All are welcome to attend.
