All other areas' adverse events relating to 'Portering' and 'Domestic & Support Services' must be reported on Datix as:

- \*Sector- Facilities and Estates (Infrastructure, Sustainability and Support Services Directorate)
- \*Service Logistics
- \*Specialty Portering

This is to ensure the correct line management have visibility of these adverse events and they can be managed appropriately.
