Our financial position/ Value and Sustainability – a message from Laura Skaife-Knight We now have our month 7 results and we can see our financial position has stabilised over the last few months with the position slightly improved in October. We are still reporting an overspend of £47.1M at the end of the financial year, however, we are confident we can still achieve our financial target of an overspend of no more that £45M provided we continue with our current cost saving measures.

So far this year we have delivered £27M of savings, a little ahead of our planned savings of £25.4M, and we continue to be on track to achieve our overall target of £61.8M. This will be an incredible achievement for NHS Grampian and one you can all be proud of. Across the organisation there are many examples of financial improvement including:

- Year-to-date, workforce and operational teams have worked hard to reduce medical agency spend by £1M while supporting doctors in having better working patterns, supported through the 'At your best with rest' campaign.
- Nursing teams have helped to reduce nurse agency spend by £2.6M this year whilst improving recruitment to substantive posts and continuing our 'Grow Your Own' career pathways.
- Procurement has supported teams to reduce discretionary spend by nearly £100k as staff carefully consider which items to purchase.

Over the coming months we will showcase more improvement stories and celebrate individual team's efforts. As we head into the busy winter months, it's important not to lose focus on money or slow the momentum we now have going in our favour. All that is left for me to say is a big thank you. Lets' keep going, and we can absolutely do this!

Praise for primary care following World Antimicrobial Awareness Week Congratulations to Insch Medical Practice and Danestone Medical Practice for their highly commended contributions to this annual campaign. GP practices were asked to take at least 3 actions during the week which included spreading WAAW messaging to the public, ensuring prescribers could access local antimicrobial guidelines and patient information resources, setting up default 5-day durations for amoxicillin and doxycycline prescriptions, and/or encouraging staff to sign up to be Antibiotic Guardians. The teams at Insch and Danestone were enthusiastic participants and have been named Antibiotic Champions by our specialist antibiotic pharmacists.

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A big week for stroke care This has been a significant week for stroke care in Grampian. Aberdeen played host to the UK Stroke Forum, Britain's biggest multi-disciplinary conference for stroke care professionals. It's the first time this event has come to the north-east and plaudits must go to those who worked behind the scenes to bring the conference to Grampian

Elsewhere, Chest Heart & Stroke Scotland are celebrating 30 years of delivering a stroke nurse service in Grampian. Over the decades, this service has supported countless individuals in their recovery after stroke. The charity has extended their heartfelt thanks to us as an organisation and the dedicated stroke nurse team for their unwavering commitment and determination to improve the lives of those affected by stroke across Grampian.
