**Ask Adam – chief executive Q&A** Several of you have been in touch asking when there will be a new episode of Ask Adam shared. We're pleased to say the finishing touches are being put to the latest edition and it will be shared later today. **Fire caused by improper battery disposal in Orange stream bags** Last month we issued a reminder about the proper disposal of batteries, in particular underlining they should **never** be placed in Orange bags. This followed a fire, caused by batteries, at a waste treatment plant. Regrettably, there has been a second fire, confirmed to have originated from Orange bags collected in Grampian. While the fire was put out before serious damage occurred, we as a board will face a financial penalty as a result.

Orange bags are for clinical waste **only**. Batteries can be disposed of by sending them to Central Stores for recycling. If you are in any doubt on how to dispose of items, contact NHS Grampians Waste Manager - <a href="mailto:gram.scar@nhs.scot">gram.scar@nhs.scot</a>

**Workplace pensions – auto-enrolment** We are required, by the UK government, to ensure all staff who are not members of a workplace pension scheme are automatically enrolled into one and then to review this on a three yearly basis. This has previously taken place on 31 May in 2013, 2016, 2019, and 2022. As our next re-enrolment date is fast approaching, we are required to review the workplace pension status of our workforce. On this date, if you are not already a member of a workplace pension, we will automatically enroll you into a workplace pension if you:

- Earn £10,000 or over per annum i.e. £833.33 per month /£192 per week
- Are aged 22 or over; and
- Are under State Pension age.

The first pension deduction will be taken from pay in June 2025. Anyone falling into the above category will receive a letter from the HR Service Centre in the coming, advising them of our intention to auto enrol them and what to do should they wish to opt out.
