Update from Chief Executive Team - a summary of key decision and discussion points The Chief Executive team met yesterday; the table below highlights the key points discussed. Matters of Concern or Key Risks to Escalate	Major Actions Commissioned/ Work Underway
Strategic Risk 3068 – Deviation from Service Standards: This remains a very high risk on our Corporate Risk Register. Discussion focused on maintaining quality of care and operational resilience. The risk will be broadened out to better reflect patient pathway and system linkages. The risk description will be slightly updated to make it clear this is about patient care. Workforce Engagement Risk 3068: Staff engagement and experience requires a strengthened focus, as reflected by our 2025 iMatter scores which show deterioration. A full review of this risk and its score was agreed Patient Flow & Discharge: Recognising the strong link between early inthe-day discharges and unscheduled care performance, an organisation-wide focus on early discharges is needed to ensure greater consistency and to further improve safety and experience for our emergency patients.	Operational governance refresh: The CEO shared proposals for revised operational governance arrangements which seek to ensure decision-making is more inclusive. A paper to return next week for discussion and feedback. Unscheduled Care & Social Care: A £4.1m winter funding bid has been submitted to Scottish Government following the recent national announcement about social care monies Planned Care Trajectories: Revised year-end trajectories for March 2026 have been submitted to Scottish Government this week. These show a 1,000 improvement for New Outpatients (52-weeks), due to £500K SG funding to support Independent Sector activity to reduce Urology waits, and a deterioration of circa 1,100 for Treatment Time Guarantee (52-weeks) due to the impact of the Central Decontamination Unit shutdown. Reduced Working Week (RWW): 81% of rosters submitted; An extraordinary AfC Programme Board will address outstanding gaps and associated risks with an update to return to next week's meeting. Occupational Health System Upgrade: Upgrade scheduled for January 2026 with essential services maintained but support reduced and alternative
	signposting to be shared. Communications plan is being prepared.

Short Stay Unit (ARI): All three theatres now operational following ventilation works, supporting improved planned care capacity.

Vaccination Uptake: Adult and child flu vaccination rates in Grampian remain above the national average, with continued improvement in social care settings.

Culture Programme Board: First meeting scheduled for 12 December 2025 to define KPIs and embed improvement actions as part of a wider Culture Programme that is under development and to be overseen by this new Board.

Strategic Risk 3068 (Deviation from recognised service standards of practice and delivery) to be broadened and reworded; mitigations strengthened.

Strategic Risk 3125 (Deteriorating Workforce Engagement) Workforce Engagement risk to undergo full review, including scoring and alignment with strategic priorities.
