Storm Amy – Amber weather warning The weather warning for Storm Amy has been upgraded to an Amber warning for strong winds across Moray this evening and into Saturday. Yellow warnings for rain and wind remain in place across Aberdeenshire and Aberdeen City. There is the risk of travel disruption, fallen trees, damage to power lines, and flooding. Please keep up to date with the forecast and plan service provision accordingly.

Windows 11 update Some concerns have been raised following yesterday's item about the Windows 11 update. To be very clear, the mention of devices being removed from the network **only** applies to those devices eligible for upgrade **and** which **have not** been upgraded by 15 October. Users of devices which can run Windows 11 will have received daily prompts to upgrade for more than a month. Upgrading, where possible, is vital to our ongoing cyber security. IT are now applying forced updates; however, it is still preferable for users to upgrade at a time which suits them, as devices are unavailable to use during upgrade.

Devices which are not compatible with Windows 11 will continue to be connected to the network and arrangements are being made to ensure their ongoing security. There's more information on the intranet here:
