Clinical Applications System replacement As of next Tuesday (6 May), the current Patient Management & Clinical Systems Registration Service will no longer be available for requesting user access to application systems. The system infrastructure is no longer supported, and we are unable to make any amendments or fixes to it. Replacement request forms will instead be available via ServiceNow. These will cover New User Access, Change User Access, and Remove User Access requests. Additionally, new Network/Email Account and On/Off boarding request forms will also be available on the same day.

Due to limitations within ServiceNow, there are changes to the process for requesting new applications. The main change is that New and Remove requests **must** now be completed by an authorising manager. Additionally, all service areas are responsible for ensuring staff are provided with the appropriate training materials and must complete all required training.

The <u>New Access Requests in ServiceNow</u> guide (networked devices only) provides more details around the changes coming.

Loop - rollout postponed Unfortunately, the rollout of Loop, the upgraded version of Employee OnLine (EOL), has been delayed. As such, our planned schedule of on-site support visits is subject to change; new dates will be advertised at the earliest opportunity. In the meantime, please use EOL as usual and do not download or register for Loop until we advise it is in use. Thank you, and we apologise for the inconvenience.

COVID-19 spring vaccination programme – Aberdeen inpatients Are you based in an inpatient area in Aberdeen City? Do you have any patients who require their COVID-19 booster? The following groups are eligible:

- adults aged 75 years and over
- · residents in a care home for older adults
- persons aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed (as defined in the immunosuppression row of tables 3 and 4 of the green book) <u>Green book on Immunisation</u> chapter 14a COVID-19

If any inpatients in your area meet the above criteria, <u>simply complete this form</u> and one of the team will be in touch with your ward before we attend. <u>For ease, consent forms are available here</u> (intranet link, networked devices only).
