New intranet homepage Our new intranet homepage will launch tomorrow (1 April). The modernisation of the intranet forms part of the ongoing security enhancements along with improvements to usability and stability. The homepage will look different to the existing version, but we have tried to keep some elements similar in order that users can easily navigate their way around it. Along with the homepage itself, there will be several other pages available in the new environment. We will then enter a phase of transferring other pages to also make them available in the new environment. Pages not yet migrated will continue to be available until migrated.

- Intranet search The native search on the new intranet homepage will search only in that
 environment. We have included a legacy search that will search the existing intranet. The
 inconvenience of this will lessen as more content is migrated and the legacy search will be
 removed when all content has been migrated, and we are ready to decommission the legacy
 intranet.
- **Navigation** When you click on the homepage, you will be taken to the new intranet homepage. If you have links in documents to the existing intranet, you should be prepared to update these once department sites have been migrated. If you have saved any favourites, these will continue to point to the existing intranet until it is decommissioned. These favourites should be updated to point to the new intranet pages once they have been transferred. The intranet link in the 'NHSG Managed Favourites' folder will be updated to point to the new intranet homepage.
- Systems and Resources Links to the intranet pages will be updated as the associated departments are migrated. As system links are not on the intranet, these should be available at launch.

Support budgets by recycling We currently spend around £125,000 every month disposing of clinical waste. An audit last year highlighted up to 12% of orange bag (clinical) waste was non-infectious, non-clinical, packaging and plastics. By recycling these materials – including soft plastic wrap, boxes, bottles and tubes – instead, we could save around £12,000 per month in disposal costs. Recycling goes in clear bags, and these should be clearly labeled. If needed, you can order new bins via PECOS (supplier is Wybone, and the order code is CAP/AP/70L/FB/GRN). Recycling stickers for the lids of the bins are available to order via gram.resources@nhs.scot
