Clinical Applications System replacement Effective today, the existing Patient Management & Clinical Systems Registration Service is no longer be available for requesting user access to application systems. Replacement request forms are instead available via ServiceNow. These cover New User Access, Change User Access, and Remove User Access requests. Additionally, new Network/Email Account and On/Off boarding request forms are also now available.

Due to limitations within ServiceNow, there are changes to the process for requesting new applications. The main change is that New and Remove requests **must** now be completed by an authorising manager. Additionally, all service areas are responsible for ensuring staff are provided with the appropriate training materials and must complete all required training.

The <u>New Access Requests in ServiceNow</u> guide (networked devices only) provides more details around the changes coming.

Cyber threats – keep up to date Recent attacks on Marks & Spencer, Co-Op, and Harrods are a reminder of the continued threat cyber criminals pose to organisations of all sizes. 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Principles of palliative care for doctors The palliative medicine department is running a face-to-face study day at Roxburghe House entitled 'Principles of Palliative Care for Doctors'. This one-day course is open to hospital doctors and GPs at all stages of training and post-CCT. It will include interactive plenary sessions with opportunities for questions and sharing of experiences. 5 CPD points have been approved by the Royal College of Physicians.

In the event of the course being fully booked, names can be added to a waiting list and these people would be given priority booking for subsequent courses.
