Foresterhill Central Decontamination Unit As many of you will be aware, the CDU at Foresterhill is currently out of use. This is to allow for proper assurance, after an unknown substance was observed on surgical instruments following processing. This of course means we have far fewer instruments available. Regrettably we are having to postpone some operations, while we prioritise emergency cases, cancer care, and caesarean sections. We know it is extremely difficult for the clinical teams involved to make these decisions and for the CDU team to not be able to provide their usual excellent service. We have approached other health boards for support and continue to work hard to minimise the disruption. Further updates will be provided as they are available.
