**Integration of acute pathways – appointment of senior responsible officer** As highlighted in the Daily Brief last week, work is beginning on three projects to fully integrate pathways of care for three acute services – endoscopy, cardiology, and orthopaedics. The aim is, at the end of the process, each service will provide safe, sustainable, and consistent care to all people living in Grampian (and beyond for regional pathways). Interim chief executive Adam Coldwells has sought a member of the Chief Executive Team (CET) to undertake the role of overall senior responsible officer, on a full-time basis.

We are pleased to announce Pam Milliken, chief officer of Aberdeenshire HSCP, has agreed to undertake this role. The chair and vice-chair of the Aberdeenshire integration joint board have confirmed their support of Pam being released for this role. The chair and vice-chair, with support from Adam Coldwells and Aberdeenshire Council chief executive Jim Savege, will seek to appoint an interim chief officer in the coming weeks. Further updates will be provided as this progresses.

**Aberdeen Dental Outreach Centre – treatment offer** The Aberdeen Dental Outreach Centre is currently inviting unregistered patients for treatment within student teaching clinics. Student treatment, provided within NHS Grampian dental clinics is free of charge, and is supervised by fully qualified and experienced dentists. If you are over 18 years of age, are not currently registered with a dentist, and are able to attend appointments during working hours, further information can be obtained by calling Argyll Dental Practice on 01224 551581 ext. 51581. An assessment is carried out prior to a patient being accepted to the student clinic to ensure student teaching requirements are matched to patient treatment needs.
