Patient Safety Alert A recent National Patient Safety Alert (*NatPSA/2025/002/UKHSA*) has highlighted outbreaks of *Burkholderia stabilis* linked to non-sterile and alcohol-free skin cleaning wipes. This is a reminder to all clinical staff that skin cleansing wipes not marked as 'sterile' may present a risk.

Non-sterile alcohol-free wipes must not be used for cleaning of intravascular devices, and non-sterile wipes must not be used for care of broken skin including wounds. Prior to accessing or changing needle free devices on Peripheral Venous Catheters (PVC) and Central Venous Catheters (CVC), the ARHAI 2022 guidance states that a single use antiseptic containing Chlorhexidine Gluconate in Isopropyl alcohol is used to clean the access hub.

Note: Please follow NHSG guidance for Chlorhexidine Gluconate and Isopropyl alcohol strengths for use in adult and paediatric patients; and for Chlorhexidine susceptibility.

Community healthcare providers should also advise patients to only use wipes marked as sterile on any broken skin including wounds.
