Staff car parking – Foresterhill To register your wish to park your vehicle in staff areas at Foresterhill, please complete this form. This form can only be accessed on an NHS Grampian device OR on a personal device which has the appropriate security settings applied. You will need to confirm your name, pay number, vehicle registration, and your line manager's name.

<u>Please refer to Friday's brief for further guidance</u>; remember, this scheme does not have a closing date, nor will registration guarantee you a car parking space. We anticipate enforcement will begin in late October/early November, but this will be advertised via this brief.

Staff 'flu vaccination Dedicated staff clinics get underway in locations across Moray and Aberdeenshire this week; please bear in mind the Moray team have advised these will be their only dedicated staff clinics, so we'd encourage you to get booked on as soon as possible. If staff clinics are not convenient, you will be able to make an appointment at public vaccination centres but remember there will be no priority access for staff at public sessions. The City programme continues as advertised. A big thank-you to those who've already come along; the turnout so far has been really encouraging.

All staff clinics are listed under 'Latest News' on the intranet, along with instructions on booking or drop-in.

ICYMI - corridor closure – ARI The 'glass corridor' on Level 1 in ARI, linking the Yellow Zone and Purple Zone, is currently closed for flooring replacement. For information, this is the floor below the main ARI concourse, where the switchboard team are normally based; if coming in at the Rotunda entrance, this is part of the corridor which leads towards the 'piano' seating area and MRI West.

We anticipate it will be closed for a further fortnight; the diversion via the Green Zone/Robertson Family Roof Garden corridor will add at least 10 minutes to journeys through the hospital. Signage is in place, and our much-valued volunteer team are supporting with wayfinding. However, we encourage all services to ensure patients are aware of the closure before they attend. This is not limited to ARI; colleagues in RACH should also ensure people using the link bridge are aware of the closure and diversion.
