Drop-in 'flu vaccination clinic – today! 'Flu season is well and truly underway. If you haven't had your vaccination yet, there's a drop-in clinic underway at Aberdeen Health Village until 1pm today. This is open to staff and eligible members of the public alike, so please spread the word.

All Grampian vaccination clinics are open for drop-ins by health and social care staff. They're also starting to offer public drop-in sessions as well; check out our dedicated vaccination website for more. Getting the jab protects you, your family, and the people we care for. If you do get 'flu - and no vaccination is 100% effective – immunisation means milder symptoms, faster recovery time, and a reduced risk of serious illness. If you've not taken up the offer yet, please give it serious consideration.

Unscheduled Care update Improving our unscheduled care performance is another of our organisational priorities (check out yesterday's brief for the latest on planned care performance). Current compliance with the 4-hour ED standard is below national expectations, and ambulance turnaround times are challenged by factors including poor flow because delays in discharging patients persist, despite targeted improvement work within wards.

This pressure is compounded by rising winter demand, such as the most recent cold snap which saw almost 160 people attend our emergency departments, following slips, trips and falls resulting from the snow and ice.

Immediate actions taken to stabilise the system include more frequent meetings of the Whole System Tactical Group to support operational oversight and forward planning. Acute and community capacity is being prioritised and a request for funding to support further social care has been made to the Scottish Government. This is alongside improved discharge processes and new rapid escalation processes for urgent operational issues. Medium-term improvement projects remain on track, including Frailty at Front Door, an Integrated Discharge Hub and Flow Navigation Centre enhancements. Recruitment for a further 114.5 WTE posts is also progressing to bolster existing teams.

Band 5 nursing review - progress report It's been a while since we shared an update on the Band 5 nursing review. As a reminder, this is part of the 2023/24 Agenda for Change pay agreement and it allows nurses currently working at Band 5 to request a re-evaluation of their post, with a possible regrade to Band 6. - There is currently no closing date for this review.
- Applications are worked through in order of the date received. We have had significant interest in this review and ask for your patience. We are currently processing applications submitted in March 2025.
- We hope to move to a more streamlined process for dealing with applications in the new year, which should reduce your waiting time significantly.
